Preeclampsia with Severe Features Debrief Form

Criteria for Preeclampsia with Severe features includes:

- ✓ Systolic blood pressure of 160 mm Hg or higher **OR** Diastolic blood pressure of 110 mg Hg or higher **ON** at least two occasions at least 4 hours apart while the patient is on bed rest (unless antihypertensive medication was initiated before this time)
- ✓ Thromocytopenia (platelet count less than 100,000/mL)
- ✓ *Impaired liver function:*
 - Elevated transaminases (2x the normal)
 - o Severe persistent unexplained RUQ or epigastric pain-unresponsive to medication
- ✓ Progressive renal insufficiency (serum creatinine greater than 1.1 OR a doubling of the serum creatinine concentration)
- ✓ Pulmonary Edema
- ✓ New onset cerebral or Visual Disturbances
